eBooks from Netlibrary/EbscoHost are incorporated into the LMN database. Netlibrary accounts are no longer valid.

### Accessing eBooks

Search for a book by author, title, subject or keyword in the library's online catalog ([www.lmn.lib.al.us](http://www.lmn.lib.al.us)). The eBook symbol is a red open book with an "e" on the cover. For targeting just eBooks, do a keyword search and add the word "electronic" after the subject heading; example: "kindergarten electronic" or "rome electronic." From the hitlist, select the eBook; then on the bib record BELOW the words "Connect to" select the link to the EBSCO Host page. Click on the link.

**To read online:** Select "eBook Full Text" from the left menu - no download required.

**To download eBooks:** Prepare your device for downloading ebooks by creating the following accounts:

1. Download the free software **Adobe Digital Editions** and create a free Adobe Online ID when prompted.
2. Create a free **EBSCOhost account**.

### Checking eBooks Out

Once the EBSCOhost account has been used to download an E-Book to your computer or e-reader, it is checked out to you. The check-out period lasts seven (7) days per title. Multiple eBooks can be downloaded and checked out at one time. After seven days, the book will disappear from your device to once again become available to other borrowers.

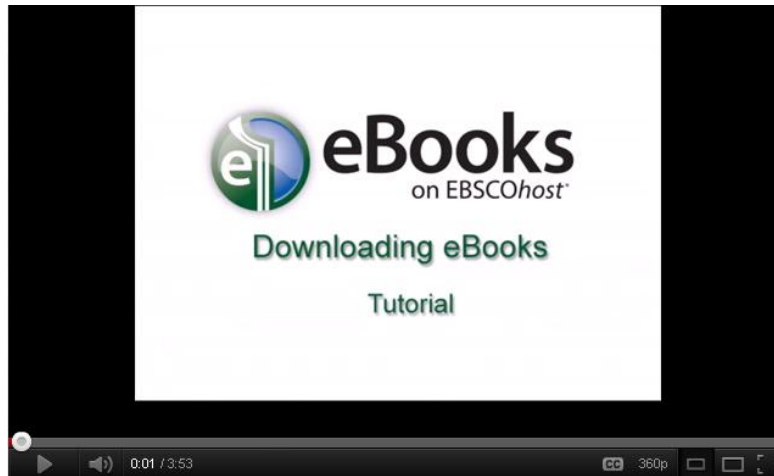
### Compatible Devices

EBSCO eBooks can be downloaded to the iPad, iPhone, Barnes & Noble Nook, all four Sony Digital Readers (PRS-300, 505, 600, 700 and 900), as well as the COOL-ER.

### Software Needed

Portable devices must have the **Adobe Digital Editions** software, while laptops need Adobe Acrobat eBook Reader software. Finally, iPads, iPhones and iPods also need the **Bluefire app**.

### SPECIFICS

#### Using the eReader device: iPad, iPhone

1. Download the **Bluefire Reader** app to the iPad/iPhone.
2. Open the Bluefire Reader app on the iPad/iPhone and authorize it by entering the Adobe Online ID created in step 1 (once the Bluefire app is opened, you should be prompted to authorize automatically).
3. From your iPad/iPhone, find an eBook in the library catalog that to download.
4. Click "Sign In" and sign in with the EBSCOhost username and password created earlier.
5. Click on the "Download This eBook (Offline)" link and then click on "Checkout & Download" button.
6. A new screen will pop up with the Bluefire Reader logo. Click on the 'Open in "Bluefire" button'. This will automatically begin downloading the eBook into the Bluefire Reader app. This may take a few minutes.

#### Using the eReader device: Nook

1. When looking at an e-book in the library's online catalog, click on the "Download This eBook (Offline)" link and then click on "Checkout & Download" button.



2. You should then be prompted to save the book to Adobe Digital Editions.
  3. Connect your Nook to the computer through its USB cable. The Nook should appear in Adobe Digital Editions (on the left side, in the listing of bookshelves, underneath all items/borrowed/purchased/recently read).
  4. Using the mouse, drag the book to the Nook. It will be copied onto your Nook immediately.

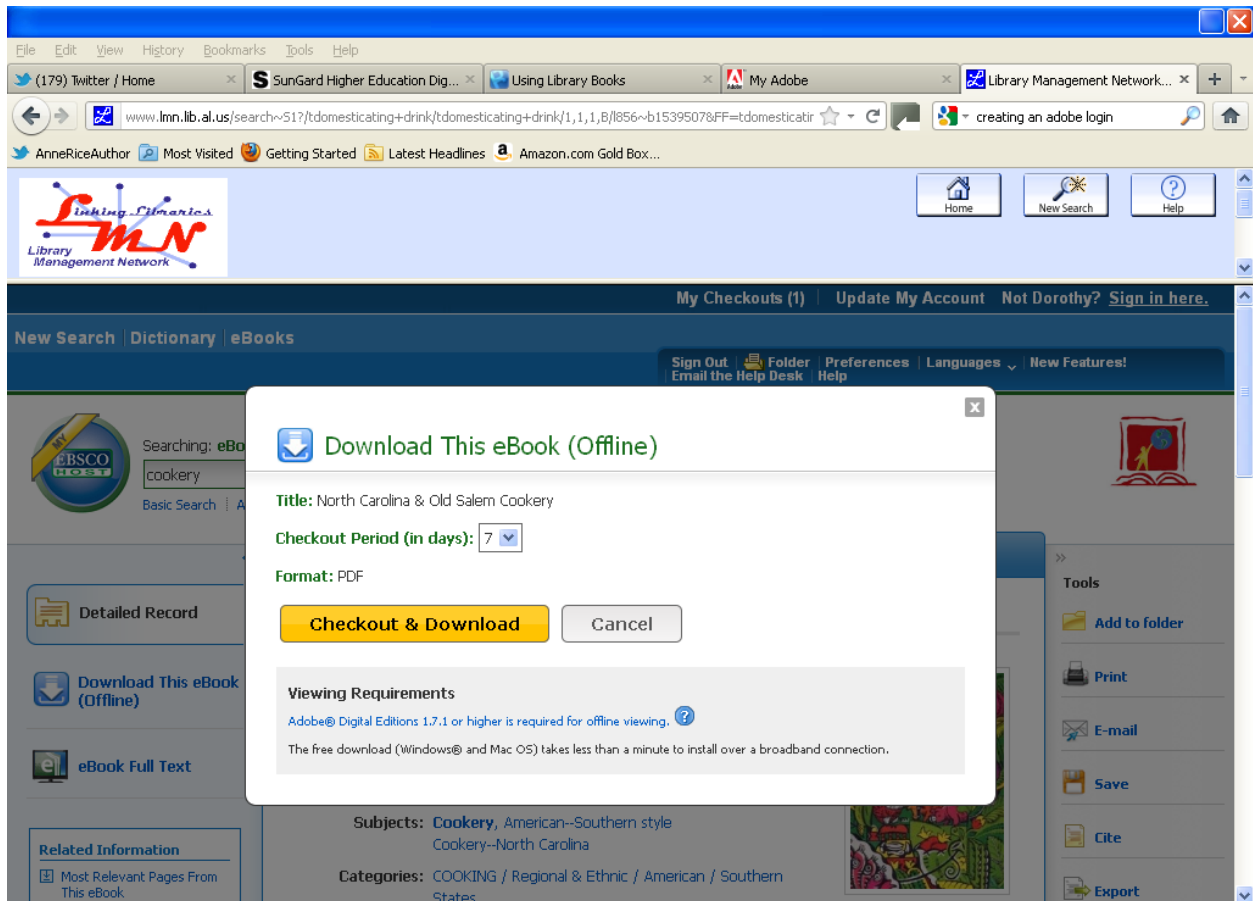

3. To download the eBook to your eReader device, select the “Download the eBook (offline)” link in the left column. To prepare your device for reading eBooks, there are one time procedures for installing software and all the software is free. The second time an eBook is downloaded and checked out, the process should be much faster.
4. Select the link to “Checkout and Download.”

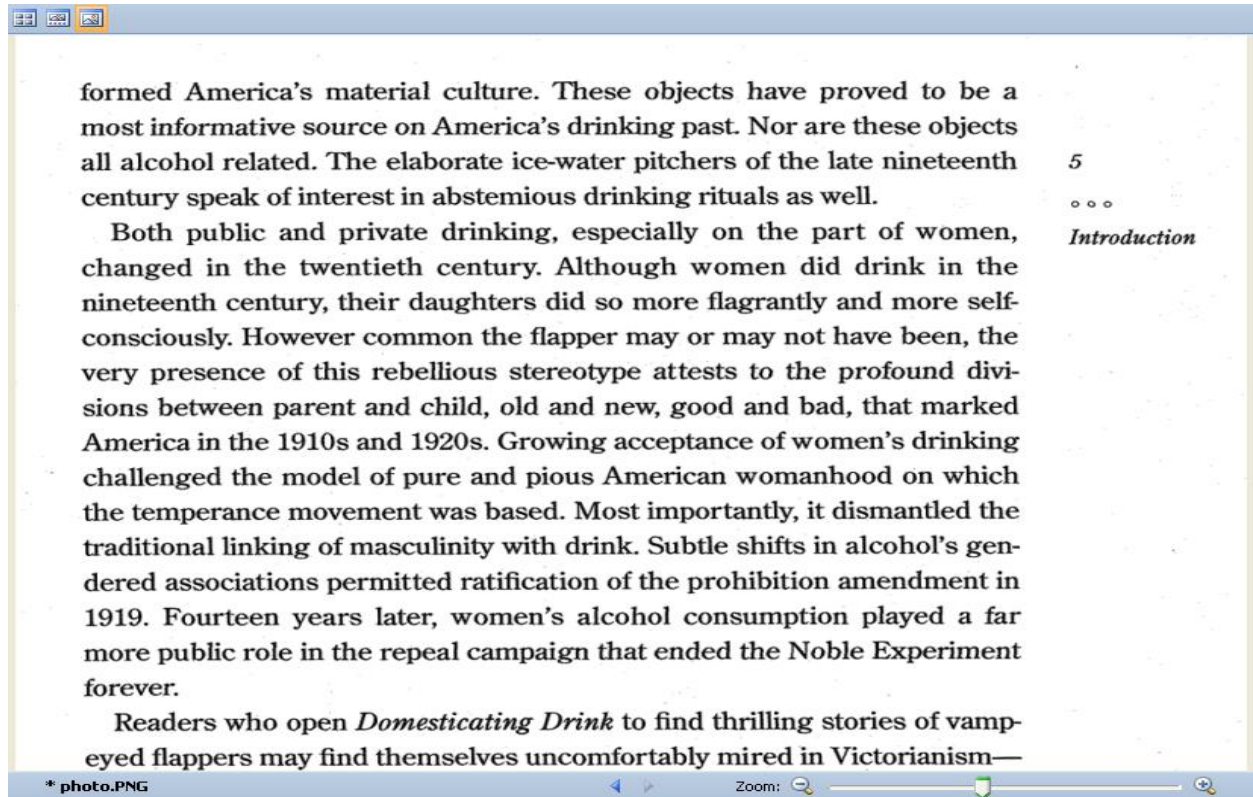


5. Adobe Digital Editions is required for offline viewing. An account and this free software can be downloaded from <http://www.adobe.com/products/digitaleditions>.
6. At this point, the Bluefire software should open automatically and the download should begin. The download will take a couple minutes (time varies by size of book and speed of internet connection)
7. Then open the ebook. The ebook can be read either landscape or portrait. If the landscape setting is selected, the page must be manually slid up to read the bottom

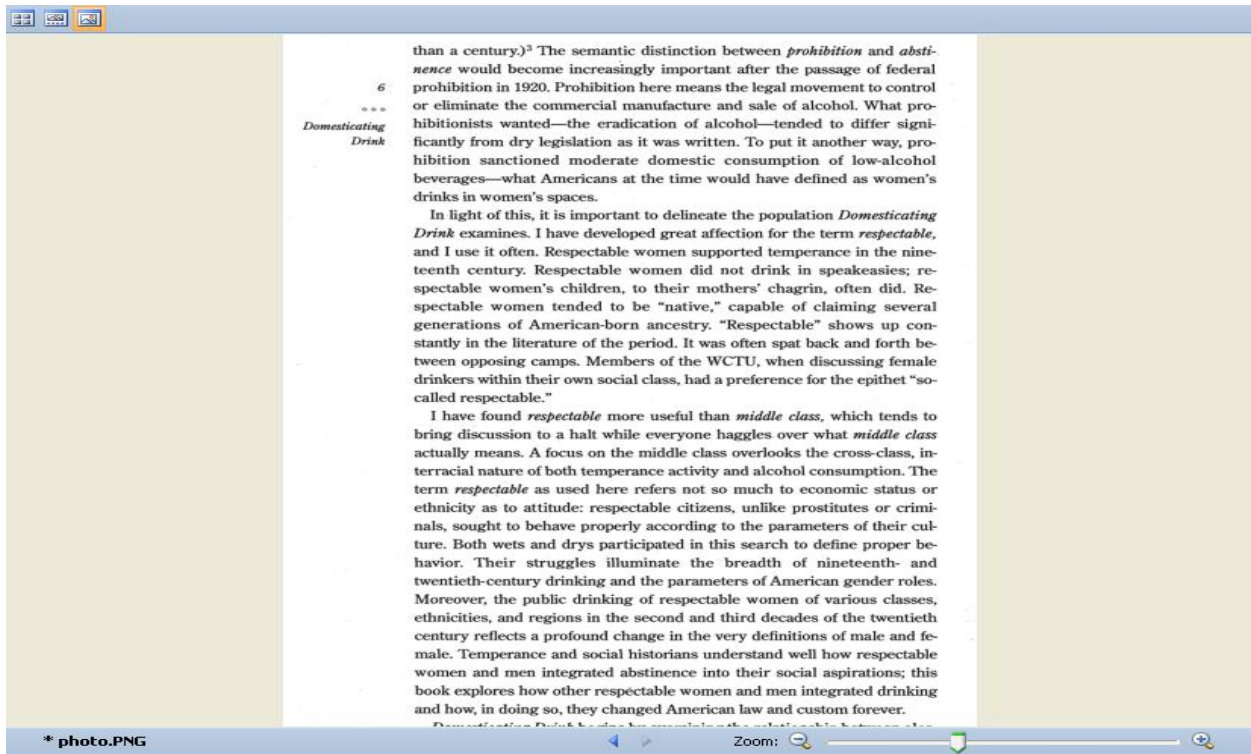

of the page. It may be possible to adjust the font to make it a little easier to read an e-book in landscape. Example:

If the following message appears, “Sorry, this ebook is in use,” the book has been downloaded.

After downloading and when finished with the book, simply delete the ebook from the ereader device.

After the allowed time of 7 days, the ebook will renew itself automatically in the EbscoHost system.
